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Snow...

Genesis 7:19 - And the waters prevailed exceedingly upon the earth; and all the high mountains that were under the whole heaven were covered.

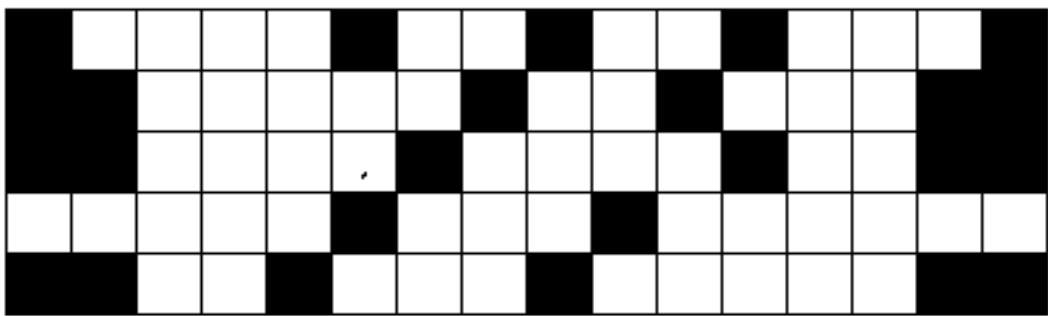

BRRRRRR! (Some references to words used for snow or cold.)

- H7950** – שלג - **sheh'-leg** - snow (probably from its whiteness): - snow (-y). -Ex. 4:6; Num. 12:10; 2Sa. 23:20; 2Ki. 5:27; Job 6:16; Ps. 51:7; Pro. 25:13;
- H7949** – שלג - **shaw-lag'** - A primitive root; properly meaning to be white; to be snow white (with the linen clothing of the slain): - be as snow. - Ps. 68:14
- H8517** – תלג - **tel-ag'** - (Chaldee); snow- Dan. 7:9
- G5510** – χών - **khee-one'** - (as descending or empty) - snow.-Mt. 28:3; Mk 9:3; Rev. 1:14;
- H7120** – קר - **kore** - cold: - cold - Gen. 8:22
- H7135** – קרה - **kaw-raw'** - coolness: - cold. - Job 24:7; 37:9; Psa. 147:17;
- H7119** – קר - **kar** - from an unused root meaning to chill; cool; figuratively quiet: - cold, excellent [from the margin]. Pro. 25:25; Jer. 18:14;

- H2779** - תרף - **kho'-ref** - properly the crop gathered, that is, (by implication) the autumn (and winter) season; figuratively ripeness of age: - cold, winter ([house]), youth. - Gen. 8:22; Psa. 74:17; Pro. 20:4; Jer. 36:22;
- H6793** - צנה - **tsin-naw'** - a hook (as pointed); also a (large) shield (as if guarding by prickliness); also cold (as piercing): - buckler, cold, hook, shield, target. - Pro. 25:13;
- G5592** - Ψυχρος - **psoo'-khos** - coolness: - cold. - Jn. 18:18, Acts 28:2, 2 Cor. 11:27
- G5593** - Ψυχρος - **psoo-chros'** - chilly (literally or figuratively): - cold. - Mt. 10:42, Rev. 3:15-16
- G5594** - Ψύχω - **psoo'-kho** - (by implication of reduction of temperature by evaporation) to chill (figuratively): - wax cold. - Mt. 24:12
