Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek Words for "Worship"

Old Testament

H7812 – שָׁחָה - shâchâh

A primitive root; to *depress*, that is, *prostrate* (especially reflexively in homage to royalty or God): - bow (self) down, crouch, fall down (flat), humbly beseech, do (make) obeisance, do reverence, make to stoop, worship.

References: Genesis 22:5, 24:26, 27:P29, Exodus 18:7, 32:8, Deuteronomy 5:9, 2 Chronicles 29:28, Job 1:20

H5457 - ܩܘܕܝܫܐ (Aramaic) - segid

י) to prostrate oneself, do homage, worship

יא) (Peal) to do homage

References: Daniel 2:46; 3:5,6,7,10,11,12,14,15,18,28;

New Testament

G4352 – προσκυνέω - proskuneō

(meaning to *kiss*, like a dog *licking* his master's hand); to *fawn* or *crouch to*, that is, (literally or figuratively) *prostrate* oneself in homage (*do reverence to, adore*): - worship.

References: Mat. 2:2,8,11; Luke 4:7,8; 24:52; John 4:20

G4576 – σέβομαι - sebomai

Middle voice of an apparently primary verb; to *revere*, that is, *adore*: - devout, religious, worship.

References: Mat. 15:9; Mark 7:7; Acts 13:43,50; 16:14

G2356 – θρησκεία - thrēskeia

ι) religious worship

יא) especially external, that which consists of ceremonies

References: Acts 26:5; Col. 2:18; Jas. 1:26,27;
